## Marriage Amendment

An overwhelming majority of North Carolinians support marriage as a sacred union between one man and one woman at one time. Many judges across the nation have overturned legislative decisions declaring marriage to be such a union.

North Carolina women recognize the importance of preserving marriage to keep our families strong, and North Carolina will undoubtedly face challenges to our current strong marriage laws. A number of bills have been filed in our Legislature but have not been brought to a vote.

We strongly urge all members of the NC Legislature to take immediate action in supporting and promoting legislation (such as Senate Bill 272 Defense of Marriage) to amend the North Carolina Constitution to specifically define marriage as the union of one man and one woman at one time, and placing the amendment before the voters of the state.

## Unborn Victims Legislation

- North Carolina does not have a law to provide for charging those who commit murder or manslaughter of a pregnant woman with additional charges for the death of her infant.
- North Carolina does not have a law to provide for separate charges against those who commit a felony or misdemeanor in an act of violence that causes injury to a pregnant woman resulting in the loss of life to her unborn child.
- North Carolina is one of only a few states not offering such laws for the protection of an unborn victim.

We strongly urge all members of the North Carolina Legislature to take immediate and decisive action to remedy this glaring miscarriage of justice and to enact legislation such as Senate Bill 26 that punishes those who do harm to an unborn child.
